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General overview

December 1989 - turning point for the spatial planning system in Romania:

- 1974 Systematization law is abolished
- systematization becomes urbanism or territorial and town planning (fr. aménagement du territoire et urbanisme /it. pianificazione urbanistica e territoriale)
- until 2001 the legal framework for spatial planning was fragile
- yet, new planning instruments are in place
- institutional responsibilities are set up at central and local levels based on the principles of decentralization
- a process to set up a status for a new profession and a specific education begins
- planning associations were set up and
- the Register of Romanian Planners (RUR) set up in 2005

General overview

Over the last 2 decades a new spatial planning framework has been developed:


- a new legal framework
- institutions
- professional associations and
- education

Main stages:

- 1st decade (1990 2000): "romantic" period of reconstruction of a spatial planning system
- the 2000s consolidation of the system and "turbulences"
- 2008 and after rethinking the system (undergoing process and attempts to reformation)

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Associations / RUR

- 1991 APUR Association of Professional Urban Planners in Romania (not very active /number of potential members was reduced)
- AUC Association of Urban Planners from Cluj Napoca
- · during the last decades many NGOs active in relation to urban issues
- 2005 / the Register of Romanian Planners (RUR) www.rur.ro
 Provided by the 2001 Planning Act
 Executive Board and a Council + working Commissions

Responsible for managing the right of professionals to sign territorial and urban planning documents, or parts of them

Includes architects, planners, landscape planners, geographers, civil engineers, economists, sociologist, ecologists etc.

Around 1850 registered members of which:

over 1400 architects

150 urbanists

150 other specialists

100 - short term higher education (conductors /bachelors)

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Associations / RUR


The Register provides special positions for professionals who got the right to elaborate and signe studies for the protection of the built-up heritage and studies of urban history as parts of a planning document.

> Only architects and urbanists can get this right of signature! RUR is a public autonomous body, but dependent on MDRT

The Ministry of Culture and National Heritage certifies the right of specialists /experts to make studies, projects concerning the PROTECTION of historic monuments (several categories: research, archeology, urbanism, architecture, gardens, structural issues etc.).

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Legal framework

December 1989 - Systematization law is abolished

1991 - Law 50 for issuing of the building permit

- accompanied by a MD (ministerial decree) – 91 /1991, which defines the new planning instruments and their content

1995 - Law 10 for the quality in the field of constructions

1996 – GD (gov. decree) for the General Urban Regulation (sets up responsibilities for issuing the building permit in protected areas)

2000 – Law 5 for approval of PATN Section V – Protected areas (sets up arbitrary limits for historic monuments and demands specific methodologies)

2001 - law 350 - The Territorial and Urban Planning Act (clarifies planning instruments and public responsibilities)

2001 - law 422 for the protection of the historic monuments

2002 - law 451 for the ratification of the European Landscape Convention

2004 - The list of historic monuments is published in the OJ (MO) - MD 2314 (updated in 2010)

Legal framework

Other significant legal documents:

- Land law 1991
- laws for the public property, cadastre and publicity
- law for the expropriation for public utility (1994, revised in 2010)
- regulations for protection of historic monuments of international importance (world heritage)
- law for environmental protection
- law for protection against natural hazards

Central and Zonal commissions for protected areas are set up (provides a consultative role by the public responsible bodies)

After 2008 - revisions of the Planning Act

Attempts to rise the efficiency and reduce the derogatory procedures.




Note:


- territorial plans have a guiding / strategic character
- urban plans are regulatory /operational and are accompanied by urban regulations (RLU regulament local de urbanism)

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PATN - Section III, Protected areas

Law 5 /2000 identifies natural and built-up / cultural areas of national interest Objective of the law: to protect, valorize and turn to good account the natural and built-up heritage

Follow-ups:

- setting up the protected areas at national level
- setting up areas for the protection of historic monuments (MI)
- \bullet demands specific studies to delineate the protection areas of the $\mbox{\it MI}$
- \bullet demands for specific methodologies for the planning documents in protected areas
- demands the elaboration of planning documents for protected areas and of specific urban regulations and of protection and conservation measures
- identifies over 500 architectural monuments and piles (14 categories) and over 150 archeological sites (11 categories)

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Zonal plan for protected areas (PUZCP)

Methodology for the elaboration and framework content of the planning documents for protected built-up areas (zonal plan for built-up areas)

Published in OJ (Monitorul Oficial), Part I nr. 125bis of 11/02/2004

- Sets up principles for approaching the planning process in protected areas in urban environment
- · Provides specific definitions
- Sets up methods and techniques for the effective elaboration of the planning documents
- Provides a specific content and graphic representation of the planning documents in protected areas
- Clarifies relationship with other planning documents (PUG or PUD)
- Describes the necessary conditions for approval of the planning
- Sets up responsibilities concerning the initiation and implementation of the plan
- Provides transitory conditions for issuing the planning /building permit
- Introduce specific urban regulations (image of the building, pavements, protection elements etc.)

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Zonal plan for protected areas (PUZCP)

Buit-up protected areas (as defined in the methodology)

Historic monuments

- monuments listed on the world heritage list
- monuments proposed to be listed on the world heritage list
- cultural heritage of national interest
- archaeological sites of national interest
- historic monuments listed (monuments, piles, sites)

Zones

- Protection zones of all categories of monuments listed above

A zone is a sum valuable constructions needing protection

Cultural landscape is considered according to the European Convention

Main steps> general historic study (on a larger area), delineation of the protected zone, zonal historic study, urban study - relationship to the other urban areas

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Zonal plan for protected areas (PUZCP)

General historic study (content)

A. written part

- Methodological note (objectives, methods, sources etc.)
- Analysis of the evolution of the territory /locality (history, population, buildings, urban structure, urban interventions etc.)
- · Identification of the valuable elements of the built-up heritage
- · Delineation of the "reference historic zones /sub-zones "
- · Delineation of "protected built-up zones"
 - · of national interest (cat. A)
 - of local interest (cat. B)

Note: protected zoned set up by the PUZCP will replace the arbitrary zones (100-500m)

B. drawings /plates

- · Historic maps
- · Working (technical) plates
- Operational plates (the historic /protected zones etc.)

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Zonal plan for protected areas (PUZCP)

Annexes to the study

- Documentary fiches
- Evaluation fiches
- Fiches of the historic zones
- Fiches of the protected zones (includes buildings, public spaces and other categories – green areas, fences etc.)
- <u>The Historic Fiche of the Locality</u> (must be part of the PUG)

Other aspects:

- Proposals for buildings to be included in LMI (list of historic monuments)
- Management and implementation issues
- Operational recommendations: development, interventions, incentives
